Members seed orders have now been delivered and seed potatoes will be delivered from the wholesaler with the first shed order at the end of February. The first shed opening will be announced during February when we can see what the weather is doing. Remember that we can still supply goods from the shed during the winter months. Just contact one of the committee members and we will arrange to get the items from the shed to you—but you will need to have the right change and pay for the goods (NO CREDIT!)

DISCOUNT OFFER FOR MEMBERS

GAGA members can now get 10% discount on purchases at Swanpit Nursery. Just show your membership card when you pay.

It is well worth a visit as they offer a wide range of plants, flower pots, planters, fencing, stones and gravels as well as garden sundries. This is still a real garden centre growing many of their own plants.

SITE SECURITY

Several members have suggested to us that we need to do something to improve security on the allotments. Over the next few weeks committee members will be setting up several security cameras which we have purchased recently. You can help too if you see strangers in the allotments, please keep an eye on them or challenge them.

WHAT TO DO – JANUARY & FEBRUARY

As the weather has been so wet it is important to keep of the soil as much as possible to avoid compacting it.

Get ready for the new season by cleaning pots seed trays and greenhouses. If the weather improves you can do winter pruning of fruit trees, start cutting back clematis and roses as well as a general tidy up of hardy perennials and grasses.

Start sowing seeds in the greenhouse of "warm weather" vegetables such as chillies, peppers, tomatoes and also broad beans for an early crop.

SHED NEWS

Have you bought anything from our shed- you should come one Sunday to see the amazing low prices that we offer on compost, canes, fertilizer and a mass of other items for the garden? This season we will also be stocking a selection of green manure seeds, mulch and John Innes compost. Let us know if there is anything else you would like us to stock.

EQUIPMENT FOR HIRE

Once the weather improves you may want to borrow our hire equipment for your garden or allotment.

We now have several pieces of equipment that members can borrow for half a day at a time (we ask for a donation of £10 to cover wear and tear, depreciation and fuel costs).

We will run through how to use the equipment safely before you take it to use.

Petrol rotavator - for cultivating/"digging" ground

Petrol strimmer- for cutting back long grass and overgrown areas

NEW Electric rake/scarifier – for removing thatch, moss and weeds from lawns.

If you need more information about how and why you would use any of this equipment, talk to Ray Finney or any other committee member.
