## WHAT TO DO IN SEPTEMBER

### Divide herbaceous perennials

Dividing perennials regularly will ensure healthy, vigorous plants that will continue to perform year after year. It also offers the opportunity to multiply your plants.

### Pick autumn raspberries

Harvest regularly, to get fruits at the peak of ripeness, when richly coloured, plump and

easy to pull off. Pick on a dry day, so the berries aren't wet.

### Collect and sow seed from perennials and hardy annuals

Growing plants from seed is generally straightforward and inexpensive. It is an opportunity to increase the number of plants in your garden for free.

### Dig up remaining Potatoes

And store in cool dark frost free place.

### Net Ponds before leaves start to fall

### Reduce the frequency of houseplant watering

### Plant Daffodills and small spring bulbs

But delay planting tulips till later.
