EVENTS 1- PLANT SWAP DAY

There will be a special "Open Day" and PLANT SWAP event on Sunday June 2nd. You are invited to bring along your spare plants to swap with those from other members. If you don't have plants to swap, there will be some plants available to buy (while stocks last).

EVENTS 2 VISIT TO RHS GARDENS BRIDGEWATER

As announced last month we are organising a trip to the Royal Horticultural Society newest garden BRIDGEWATER. This is now confirmed and will take place on Friday July 12th. Admission for our party is free on this day, normally £15.80 per person. Booking forms have been sent out to members with a

warning that we are limited to 55 visitors. If you want to come and have not yet returned your booking form you should do so as soon as possible. Once we reach 55 names, we can accept no more requests.

We can also provide an RHS discount card so that any two members can visit one of the RHS gardens (Bridgewater, Hyde Hall, Wisley, Harlow Carr or Rosemoor) for half price- contact Bob Colman for more details or to borrow the card.

WHAT TO DO IN JUNE

Put hanging baskets outside now risk of frost has passed.

Stake tall plants to avoid them falling over.

Prune spring flowering shrubs such as forsythia and flowering currants.

How borders and veg. plots regularly to keep down weeds.

Mow lawns regularly and feed if grass begins to look pale, but avoid feeding if weather forecast is for very high temperatures and no rain (We wish!)

Pinch out side-shoots on cordon tomatoes and start to feed with high potash feed weekly once you see the first fruits forming.

Shade greenhouse if exposed to mid-day sun to prevent scorching plants.

And finally--- remember to sit down and appreciate your garden
